




What do we do?

- * We do, well, everything:
- Provide radio communications for safety
- * Provide communications for event logistics
- Keep track of runners / cyclists / rally cars
- * Keep the event organizers apprised of activities
- * Arrange for emergency response
- Drive a truck with food or luggage
- Give a broken-down cyclist a lift
- Summary: Event Communications and Event Logistics



Why?

- * Problem statements:
- * Many events need help with logistics and communications
- * Commercial radio solutions can have \$\$\$ budgetary impact
- Event staff do not always understand how to use radio gear
- * Many (not all) events are fundraisers of some sort
- Usually operating in non-urban areas (lack of cell service)

When?

- * A wide variety of groups need us:
- * MS Society MS Walk Mid-June, MS Bike TBD June-July
- * Hostelling Canada K-100 relay race June
- Tour for Kids July
- Banff-Jasper Relay Early June
- * Elbow Valley Cycle Club "Golden Triangle" Late May
- * Calgary Sports Car Club Stage Rallies March, May, October
- * Equestrian ride support June, August

How big are these events?

How we help

- * Follow established practices:
- * All positions have usually been done before
- Listen to direction given by organizers
- Help them out as required
- Get yourself to the event and back
- * Food is usually provided for long events, hotel for overnights, sometimes fuel reimbursement, sometimes a t-shirt
- * Bring your own radio gear, be prepared to be outdoors for up to 12 hours and be self-sufficient

What do I need?

- * Basic equipment list:
- * PPE reflective vest, hat, sunscreen, bug spray, appropriate clothing for any weather (welcome to Alberta)
- * Vehicle almost anything you can sit in for hours at a time. Rarely is this provided unless you are needed in a cube van or 5 ton truck. Fill up your fuel before you leave home. Sometimes there are positions for cyclists or motorcyclists.
- * Radio gear for most positions:
 - * HT with spare batteries at a minimum, plus
 - * 25 or 50W VHF radio and 5/8 or better antenna
 - Cross-band capability an asset in some positions
 - * Bringing along too much radio gear is **never** a problem
 - * Cellphone an asset in some situations

What is Event Net Control?

- * It's from where the event is managed:
- * All aspects of the event are managed here like food, accommodations, unforeseen weather handling, STARS, lost children . . .
- * Direction given to radio and event volunteers
- Wide variety of radio experience is needed for these positions
- * Just as in communications Nets, Net control takes over frequency(ies) for the duration of the event and all comms are filtered through Net Control

How do I get involved?

- * Ask around:
- * CARA Website calendar
- * Email distributions
- * Contact the agencies listed and ask for contact to the event coordinator. Explain you are a new radio operator and want to get involved.
- * Find VE6LK he knows most of the volunteer coordinators.
